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
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
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GRANTS BY DOMAIN

NUMBER OF GRANTS






GRANTS BY OUTCOME



WHAT WAS THE MOST SIGNIFICANT CHANGE YOU SAW AS A RESULT OF YOUR PROGRAM. EVENT OR TRAINING?

"Participants have built new healthy habits new friendships for life."

"15000 attendees experienced diverse arts, culture and food."

"The town - as a collective - seems to have a renewed sense of purpose, pride and optimism."

"The community can now have more discussion on this topic which cause more interaction within the community."

"Children are most excited about participating in sports now that they have access to better equipment."

"We have seen more of a demand for the installations than we initially expected so, once the first project is completed, we will be looking at expanding the scope for the second effort."

"Increased community engagement and greater community cohesion.

"Increased collaboration between research bodies"

GRANTEE FEEDBACK

DID YOU EXPERIENCE ANY UNINTENDED NEGATIVE OUTCOMES AS A RESULT OF YOUR PROGRAM, EVENT OR TRAINING?

"Community engagement decreased in other creative spaces."

"Inadvertently lost resources from other research areas."

"Students didn't treat the new balls with care, so there was an initial loss of roughly 10% of the purchased goods."

"The number of graduates out-matched the number of available bakery jobs for the season."

"There was an initial glut of donated shoes, which caused storage complications while the volunteers worked through the initial shoes

"During the construction phase, accessibility to the building was greatly hindered, which make pick up and drop off much more difficult for students and parents."

"Pocket pantry users weren't very good at returning recipes, which meant only a few users had access to this benefit."

GRANTEE FEEDBACK

DID YOU LEARN ANY SIGNIFICANT LESSONS AS A RESULT OF YOUR PROGRAM, EVENT OR TRAINING?

"Through this project we provided yet further evidence of the importance of exercise and social inclusion to good physical and mental health outcomes."

"Learned heaps about marketing and social media, and about keeping volunteers engaged. A steep learning curve!"

"It is important to obtain multiple quotes and recommendations on which companies are reputable, trustworthy and responsible."

"We are learning new and exciting things about the instalation of the micro wind farms, their efficacy in a real world setting. We have also learned that there is more wildlife to deal with than we ever expected at the top of these high rise buildings and have made some significant steps in combining conservation efforts."

"We have better expanded our understanding of renewable energy sources for use in infrastructure projects. This has better informed us to undertake future projects. The published report will form an important basis for future studies."
